Easy and Delicious Strawberry Bundt Cake!

**makes about 10 mini Bundt cakes*

Cake Ingredients

- 1 white cake mix
- 3 TBS flour
- 1 small box strawberry Jello (DO NOT use sugar free)
- 3/4 cup vegetable oil
- 3/4 cup water
- 1/2 cup frozen sliced strawberries with juice
- 3 large eggs
- 2 tsp vanilla extract



Strawberry Glaze

- 1.5 cups powdered sugar
- 3 TBS of the crushed strawberry juice
- 2 TBS melted butter
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/4 tsp almond extracts

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
2. In your mixing bowl, whisk together the cake mix, flour, and jello to combine dry ingredients.
3. With mixer on low, pour in the oil, water, and strawberries with juice.
4. Add eggs and vanilla
5. Increase mixer speed to medium/high and beat for 2 minutes
6. Pour into heavily greased bundt pan and bake for 37-40 minutes. (Insert a toothpick in the middle of the cake, if the toothpick comes out clean, without any batter on it your cake is done).
7. Allow cake to cool for 10 minutes, then invert pan onto a cake plate.
8. Whisk together all ingredients for the glaze, drizzle over almost cooled cake.

1. Bad things happen to good people.
2. In the midst of suffering, never lose hope in God.
3. Our friends may fail us in the midst of misery, but God never does.
4. Even in the middle of **God's silence**, His presence is with us.
5. Wisdom comes from fearing God's anger and turning away from evil.
6. **God is with us even in a storm.**
7. God is in control.
8. Sometimes when we are suffering, we are tempted to sin.
9. Sometimes **we take our anger out on our friends or family.**
10. After repentance and forgiveness comes BLESSINGS.

Lessons from the Book of Job-what to say and not to say to someone who is suffering

DO NOT SAY.....(Job's friends listened at first and then they gave him all kinds of advice)

1. They are in a better place or they are not in pain anymore.
2. You will get married again.
3. You can always have other children or at least you have children
4. IT IS TIME you got yourself together. (Every person goes through the stages of grief in their own way and on their own time table)
5. I am sure it will be better soon, or you tell them God's plans are always best. (When someone is grieving or suffering it is usually best just to be there and LISTEN)

THINGS TO SAY

1. You are not alone. I will be here **whenever you need me.**
2. **I can't imagine** how painful this must be. (Don't assume your pain will be the same as theirs so phrase your words carefully)
3. What can I do to help?
4. Grief is a normal and natural reaction. (Each person takes a different amount of time to walk this road)
5. If they need time alone, RESPECT that.
6. **Acknowledge you don't know what to say.** (**LISTEN** is the best thing to do)
7. Give them a hug. (If social distancing has been relaxed)
8. **LISTEN!**
9. Let them know you are thinking about them.
10. Invite them to take a walk, a ride or take them a meal and remember to **LISTEN!**

There are many websites to research for more information on what to do when someone is grieving.

Our IC chaplain is Patricia (Patti) Gale. She will send the IC Chaplain's report to me on Sunday evenings.

I will try to forward to you by **Monday**. Please remember if your chapter reports the loss of a member or their immediate family, include their physical address, **EMAIL address, and CELL #**. If they prefer this information is shared **ONLY with our state**, please state that in your message. Otherwise, I will forward it to the IC Chaplain.

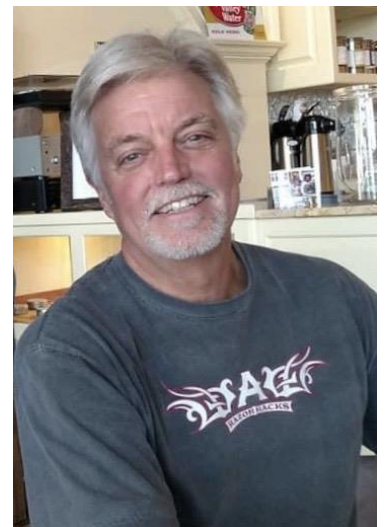
St. Jude Chair

E SA Foundation Members: Recent developments regarding the spread of the new Coronavirus (COVID-19) has many organizational leaders re-evaluating their meeting plans and Foundation is no different.

This has given the ESA Foundation Board an opportunity to review options on how they continue to fulfill their obligations to the membership when conducting business. Technology has given them the opportunity to explore ways to conduct business and get things done in a very efficient way.

Therefore, the Board has taken the appropriate measures to conduct the election of two new Directors for the coming year by electronic voting. Every paid voting member of the Foundation will have an opportunity to vote electronically.

A ballot will be sent to every active member in good standing (meaning dues have been paid) with a current email address on file. I have verified Foundation members email addresses with membership rosters on our web page.

Voting will begin on June 22nd and end on June 29th, 12 midnight MT. Instructions on voting will be included in the email with your ballot.
